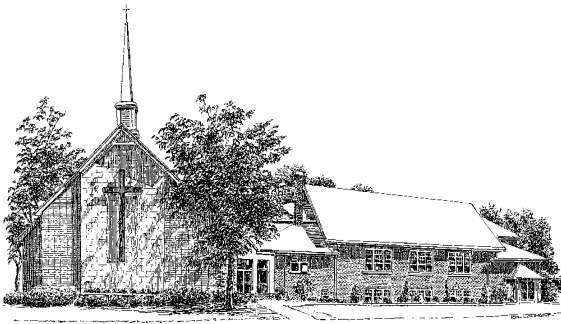

## PASTOR'S PLACE

Dear Friends:

I hope that all of you are enjoying these lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer. Without a doubt the pace here at the church has slowed down in some areas. However I must admit that there are other areas in the life of the church that become more intense during the summer months. For example, when I take vacation and/or study leave time I have to find pastors to cover for me in emergencies and sometimes I have to prepare multiple bulletins weeks in advance. I'm grateful that our worship and music chair, Debbie Goggins, takes care of finding folks to fill the pulpit for me on Sundays.

I want to take this opportunity to help you play catch up with some of the things that have happened so far this summer. For example, our church had a very good turn out and level of participation for Vacation Bible School. That is definitely a positive.

The Monday night forum has had some fun viewing several movies and discussing them. We are now on a hiatus until September. But it was still fun to get together.

There is one occurrence that might come as a surprise to some of you, but, in truth, I think many of us have sensed this coming for a while. The West Seneca church, at least for right now, will no longer be taking an active role as a support church for the Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Buffalo. At a recent dinner, our congregation was acknowledged for 10 years of service as a support church to the host church in Orchard Park Presbyterian.

When I first came to this church nearly 6 years ago, the participation level from members of our congregation was quite good. But in the last year or so, Diane Molnar and Barb Kissel have found it increasingly difficult to get people to fix a meal or stop by during the hosting. Diane and Barb spoke with me about their fatigue factor and said that they no longer felt they could keep this going on their own. They had reached out on a continual basis, but the help and enthusiasm simply were not there.

Our church's involvement in IHN probably enjoyed Session's approval when it began. It seemed only right that Session weigh in on ending that involvement. At a recent special meeting, Session reluctantly approved the request to end our involvement as a support church. There was an overall sense that new leaders were not to be found.

I have two important comments to make. First of all, from the bottom of my heart I want to thank Diane and Barb (and countless others) who have given heart and soul to this mission over the past 10 years. It really did serve as the cornerstone of our mission work. But I also want to applaud them for knowing when "enough is enough," in the same way that I applaud Session for making a difficult decision. If the help and interest are not there, it's time for our involvement to end.

And that brings me to my next point. At that Session meeting I said that if we really believe that there is a time and season for everything and that death is a natural part of life, then we had to accept that it was time to let this go, difficult and sad though it was. I also stated that if we truly embrace the gospel message of natural death and resurrection to new life that we needed to pray that the Spirit will work within us and lead us in a new mission direction. Of course we may need to be patient and we need to grieve the loss of an outreach program that meant a great deal to many people in the church for 10 years. But in hope and in trust and in faith and in time, some new opportunity will surface and hopefully we will, with the help of the Spirit, be able to discern a new direction.

I think that hits some of the news from the summer months. I continue to pray that you all will enjoy your summer rest and recreation in safety. And that you will be energized for what will come in September. Until then, God bless and be safe and I will see you soon!

### KICKOFF SUNDAY

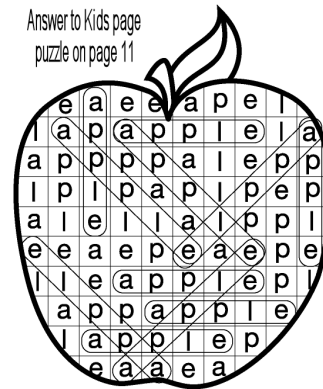

## PRESBYTERY UPDATE

### **What Happened at Presbytery? Written by Rev. Rex Stewart, Moderator**

Our meeting of the Presbytery of Western New York on Tuesday, July 24<sup>th</sup> at Duffield Presbyterian Center was full of meaning and poignancy, for it may well be the last time the presbytery meets on the grounds that so many hold sacred. After a pre-meeting First Time Elder Orientation led by Council President, the Rev. Lance Brown, the meeting began with a greeting from our host, the Rev. Laura Norris-Buisch, who then introduced Elder Bill Springer, Chairperson of the Duffield Committee. Bill eloquently told of the decades of ministry accomplished and the lives changed at Duffield. He then presented the presbytery a beautiful photo montage showing images of the camp from the 1950s to the present day.

In my moderator's report, I talked of my just-completed mission/study trip to Salvador, Brazil, coming home in time to moderate the meeting (I could legitimately claim that I came the farthest to make the meeting!). The consent agenda was passed without comment, a few more folks were nominated to the new ministry teams, and an added item on the agenda, the Pierce Avenue Church's Administrative Commission's recommendation to approve the sale of the former church's building to The United Church Covenant of Grace Ministries in Niagara Falls for \$50,000, was approved after a few questions were answered.

We said both goodbye and hello to the Rev. Laura Norris-Buisch as she comes to the end of her work as Director of Duffield and begins her new work as Stated Supply Minister at Riverside Presbyterian Church in Niagara Falls. Elder Bill Springer again eloquently spoke of Laura's considerable skills and talents leading our camping ministry over the past three years and presented her with a beautiful watercolor painting of the Duffield pond painted by Mary Mohlke.

Council President, the Rev. Lance Brown, gave a Council Report that highlighted the council's attempts at improving its processes and communication within and beyond the presbytery, a report that elicited grateful applause. He also relayed the information that a potential buyer for the camp has withdrawn his offer.

After announcements, the meeting ended with rousing worship led by the children and youth from this week's camp at Duffield. Joyous and wistful songs were sung, and heartfelt and emotional faith stories were shared, focusing on the Letter to the Hebrews, chapter 11, and the journey of faith we share as brothers and sisters. Then, we adjourned to enjoy ice cream sundaes and the beauty of our surroundings.

# Easy Applesauce Muffins

*This healthy recipe will make a great start to your day, a great snack or a great gift for your teacher and classmates.*

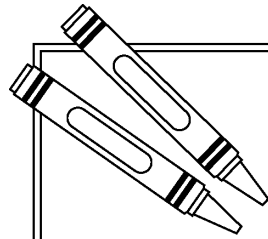
## What you need:

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 1 1/2 cups chunky applesauce
- Baking cups



## What you do:

1. With an adult's help, heat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a 12-cup muffin tin with baking cups and set aside.
2. In a small, microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter on high for about 30 seconds; set aside to cool slightly.
3. Sift together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in to a large mixing bowl.
4. In another large bowl, whisk together the eggs and brown sugar. Stir in the applesauce and melted butter until the mixture is smooth.
5. Pour the apple mixture over the flour mixture. Stir with a wooden spoon just until the flour disappears. (This will produce muffins with a nice, crumbly texture.)
6. Fill the baking cups about two-thirds full with batter. (For mess-free muffins, use an ice-cream scoop to spoon batter into the baking cups.)
7. Bake for 20 minutes or until light brown. Test for doneness by inserting a toothpick in the middle; if it comes out clean, the muffins are ready to eat. Makes 12.

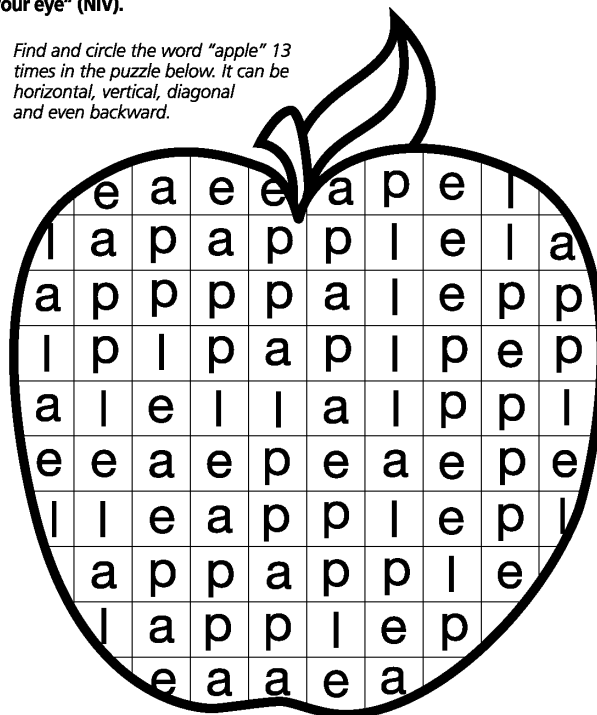
